From Rev. David

In December 2016, in what was described as 'the first step to enable humanity to consume pies with more elegance and comfort', a meat and potato pie was launched into the stratosphere onboard a weather balloon from Roby Mill in Wigan and then released to fall to earth again. The makers of the pie predicted that it would freeze on the way up and be cooked on its return journey, thus altering the molecular state of the pie, and potentially making it even more delicious. Once the pie was recovered from its landing spot in North Yorkshire, the pie researchers concluded that the flight had made no difference at all, and life in the meat and potato pie community returned to normal.

Another heroic failure, of course, but a brave attempt nonetheless. Over the years I have sat sadly in church meetings and watched far, far better ideas than that die at the hands of risk-averse church members, very keen to point out how the idea might fail, the thousand things that could possibly go wrong. Even worse, of course, is the smugness of the post-event analysis expert who tells us what we *should* have done (having failed to mention this earlier).

Of course, we need to assess risks sensibly, and of course blatantly stupid ideas need to be avoided, and of course we need to be prudent stewards of the resources entrusted to us. But do you think that, things being as they are, we need to be more open to taking risks, more ready to give things a try to see if they might work?

Abraham's story in Genesis is one of taking the risky first step in the full knowledge that this might not work – but, then again, it just might. And Abraham's openness to take those risks no doubt attracted its fair share of sadly shaken heads and slow sucking in of breath. Yet Abraham took the risk. God's people, it seems to me, are more often than we sometimes think called to leave the security of 'what we always do', to put our hand into the hand of God who travels with us, and to take the scary first step.

As we continue to work through the implications of our Circuit Review, and as we continue to explore what God is calling us to do and to be in our place and in our time, may we have the courage to take risks, to try out those good ideas to see if they work, even to risk failure. And may we too catch some of the excitement of those pioneers, those explorers of unknown territory and hear the voice of God calling us on:

'So if you want to be with me all your days, keep up the moving and travelling on, you're the People of God.' (StF 473)


