From Rev. Marian Olsen:

Does it feel like things are getting back to normal after Christmas and after the snow? If so, does the sense of normality feel comfortable or do you find yourself waiting for the next interesting thing to happen?

Perhaps, looking at world events, nothing really feels normal. Perhaps, seeing how climate change is making things such as forest fires and flooding worse, you find yourself questioning whether life will ever feel normal again.

In this period between Epiphany and Lent, I often wonder what normal was like for Jesus in the time he was growing up and in his twenties. We jump from the birth of a baby, sometimes briefly glimpsing an event from when he was twelve (and certainly not the mild obedient child which the Victorians suggest in 'Once in royal') to the mature man ready to step into a new phase of his life and his three years of ministry.

Jesus is fully human as well as fully divine. He will have done the ordinary and necessary things in life. As a child and adolescent, he grew up in Palestine at a time when the occupying forces of the Roman empire were a significant presence. Jesus' normality was in some ways different from ours but in other ways, day to day, he will have had mundane things to deal with.

In the gospels we hear about Jesus eating meals. We read of him walking from place to place. Both these normal human activities are parts of daily life which Jesus makes holy by the way he inhabits them. He eats with a whole mixture of, to some minds, questionable characters. He responds with wisdom and healing power to those who call out to him on the way as he walks past.

We celebrate Christmas and Easter, we observe Advent and Lent, for a few weeks now we are in

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what the lectionary refers to as Ordinary time. Let's celebrate the normal and the ordinary. In Celtic spirituality there is a practice of accompanying activities such as washing and baking and cleaning with specific prayers, recognising the sacredness of daily life.

God chose for Jesus to live a life which included the ordinary. God does not shy away from the human body or everyday necessities. Let's give thanks for whatever our normal is and allow ourselves to recognise the gift which it is.

'Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.' 1 Thessalonians 5:16


